First bid is Knife River they submitted a hot mix asphalt unit cost bid of one plant for the Idaho Falls plant is \$67 a ton. Next bid is HK Contractors submitted a bid for two locations one is the Willow Creek hot plant in Idaho Falls which is \$69.50 per ton and the Teton hot plant is \$72.50 per ton. Last bid is Depatco has submitted one location in Idaho Falls unit cost is \$67.50 a ton. That is all of the bids that were submitted for the 2023 asphalt contract. Will tabulate the bids and calculate a haul cost with mileage on each bid. Then at the next meeting they can decide on a contract.
